Link to Hope Shoebox Appeal

We are again supporting this charity appeal, but with a different approach - which we hope will make the process easier for people. If you are willing to bring in a few items suitable for the appeal, please leave them in the Porch Room, or speak to Di Skinner. A small group will then meet at church to fill some boxes with the donated items. Alternatively, if you would prefer to fill a shoebox yourself, that would be great too. The boxes will need to be ready for dispatch around the end of October. (Exact date to be confirmed.)

We do hope to have some Link to Hope leaflets shortly, which specify the items needed. In the meantime, please use this guidance taken from the charity's website. It requests **that every box should contain at least one of each of the following items:**

Gloves; hat or scarf; toothbrush and paste; candles and holder, or tea lights; sweets or chocolates in packets (EU origin); soap & flannel; small games.

Then there's a choice of supplementary items to include, depending on whether the box is for a family or an elderly person. Suggestions include:

- Colouring pads, crayons, pencils, calculators, A5 pads.
- Small toys e.g. yo-yo, skipping rope, toy car.
- Gifts for parents e.g. DIY tools, tape measure, head scarf, jewellery.
- Toiletries - shampoo, new make-up, moisturiser, hairbrush.
- Reading glasses, wooden cutlery, sensory items, hot water bottle, work gloves, socks & tights (new), wind-up radio/torch, scissors, nail clippers.
